The following narrative is merely a summary of events that occurred on July 10, 2022.

At approximately 1:40 P.M., while on uniformed patrol, in marked cruiser #25, I (Officer Chy Lim), responded to Market Basket, located at 1900 Main Street, for a reported disturbance. Sergeant Joseph Kelley also responded.

Upon arrival, I saw a group of people gathered at the entrance to Market Basket, on the south side of the building. Sgt. Kelley was already on scene, speaking to Market Basket managers, later identified as Christopher George and Rafael Colon Christopher stated that he was approached by numerous customers stating that they were being harassed by protesters, while trying to enter the building.

The protesters were later identified as Wesley L. Mcenany and Jonathan Grossman (DOB 11/02/1956). Wesley and Jonathan were protesting customers from signing a petition that was organized by two other people at the entrance, later identified as James Lyons and Evelyn Curley James and Evelyn were sitting at a table trying to get people to sign a petition to "VOTE NO, NO LICENSES FOR ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS".

James and Evelyn stated that Wesley, and Jonathan were harassing people, and trying to prevent them from signing the petition. James also stated that they were blocking people from coming to their table. Sgt. Kelley and I spoke with Wesley afterwards, and he stated that he was not preventing people from signing the petition, and claimed that he was merely giving them reasons why they should not sign the petition. Wesley stated that he was not harassing customers, and stated that he left customers alone, if they did not want to hear what he had to say.

After speaking with both groups, they stated that they would give each other space to do what they needed to do. A short time later, Christopher and Rafael informed Sgt. Kelley that they wanted the two groups off the premises. Christopher stated that the two groups were causing too much of a disturbance for their customers, as well as making it hard for customers to enter the store. Sgt. Kelley and I notified both groups that they needed to vacate the premises. Both groups acknowledged, and cleared the scene without incident.
